Student Entertainment Events, the Adele H. Stamp Student Union, the Student Homecoming Committee and Pepsi are pleased to announce the University of Maryland's annual Homecoming Comedy Show. On Thursday, Oct. 18, Bob Saget, Jamie Kennedy and Jeff Ross will bash and banter Cole Field House after the pep rally starting at 7:30 p.m. Tickets are available at the Hoff Ticket Office in the Stamp Student Union. They are \$5 for bowl seats and \$10 for floor seats with a UMID and \$20 for bowl seats and \$30 for floor seats for the general public.

The University's student population best remembers Saget as America's favorite dad in the hit 1990's series, "Full House." He may also be remembered as the amiable host of "America's Funniest Home Videos." In recent years, Saget has transformed in the public eye from Mr. Tanner and pleasant host to lascivious stand-up comedian and actor. Among many noteworthy appearances as a comedic actor are Saget's roles in "Half Baked," "Dumb and Dumberer" and "The Aristocrats." Even more recently, Saget voiced-over, wrote, produced and directed the 2007 hit film "Farce of the Penguins." This past August, Saget's HBO special: BOB SAGET: THAT AIN'T RIGHT, aired for the first time. Saget has also appeared on Jamie Kennedy's MTV Series "Blowin Up" with a music video "Rollin' With Saget," which went on to win a Fuse TV award.

Jamie Kennedy's popularity grew after a humble career start with his character in the hit 1996 horror flick, "Scream." "Scream" opened doors for Kennedy that led him to smaller roles in the films "As Good As It Gets," "Enemy of the State," "Three Kings," and "Jay and Silent Bob Strike Back," among others. With the will to do more with his career by way of comedy though, Kennedy formed the production company Wannabe Productions. Through the company he wrote and produced the WB shows "The Starlet" and "Living with Fran," his reality show "The Jamie Kennedy Experiment" and the MTV show "Blowin Up." In 2003, he wrote and starred in the film "Malibu's Most Wanted." In this past year, Kennedy starred in "Kickin it Old School," "Parental Guidance Suggested" and "Blonde Ambition."

He has earned himself the title of “Roastmaster General” at New York’s Friars Club, and has appeared on the lot of late-night TV shows. Ross’ 2005 documentary about his experience entertaining the U.S. troops stationed in Iraq, “Patriot Act: A Jeffrey Ross Home Movie,” received the best feature award at the Montreal Comedy Festival. He has also appeared on the popular series “Six Feet Under” and “Weeds” and the films “Stuck on You” and “The Aristocrats.”
