Student Entertainment Events is pleased to announce its full 24th annual Art Attack line up featuring The All American Rejects, Die Mannequin, Rahzel and Washington Social Club on Friday May 4th. Doors for this event will open at 4:30 p.m. and the event will start at 5 p.m. in Byrd Stadium. Tickets for the concert are free for those with a UMCP ID at the Union Ticket Office. The general public can purchase tickets at ticketmaster.com or any Ticket Master location for \$15.

The All American Rejects first started to form when Tyson Ritter, vocals and bass, and Nick Wheeler, guitar and programming, met at a party in high school. Currently their album, "Move Along" has cemented the band as fixtures of popular music, garnering three straight top 10 hits, "Dirty Little Secret," "Move Along," and most recently "It Ends Tonight."

Die Mannequin, a Toronto based band, released their first album titled "How to Kill" on January 16, 2007. They find inspiration from the bands Influenced by Sonic Youth, Queens Of The Stone Age, and Blonde Redhead. Recently, Die Mannequin toured with Guns N' Roses and Buckcherry.

Rahzel, a former member of The Roots, is known for his beatboxing and singing concurrently. Billboard Magazine says, "Everyone should experience his fascinating rhythms...using just his lips, cheeks, gums, and Adam's apple he (recreates), with amazing accuracy and detail, tracks from the magic mixing desks of Pete Rock...and others."

The lineup includes two Maryland Alumni who are in indie rock band Washington Social Club. The band is thought of as the mainstay of the Washington D.C. music scene and is preparing for the release of their second album "Bigger than Your Boyfriend." Their first album titled "Catching Looks" includes the underground hits "Charlie the Russian" and "Dancing Song."
